Charlie Olszewski has been doing seminars on scams since 2019 and wants people to know "The more you know about scams and how they operate, and the more careful you are in how you respond to money or personal information requests, the less likely you are to be a victim."

# Fort St. Joseph Archaeological Project, Lunch at Pizza Transit and Fort St. Joseph Museum Friday, July 22

Fort St. Joseph was a mission, garrison and international trading post occupied from 1691 to 1781. The French built the fort as a trading post on the lower St. Joseph River. The site had been taken over by

the British, the Spanish, and the United States, earning Niles the nickname City of Four Flags. The site fell into ruins and was only rediscovered in 1998. An archeology excavation has been under way since 2002. Join us to walk on the same land as those who worked and visited the fur trade site. Please note we will be walking on uneven ground.

Lunch will be at Pizza Transit, downtown Niles, and then we will travel to Fort St. Joseph Museum to learn more about Niles from the prehistoric era through the 17th century founding of Fort St. Joseph to the modern business and industrial era.

# **RECIPE: Red, White and Blue Yogurt Parfaits**

A layered red, white and blue yogurt parfait made with wholesome, natural ingredients, perfect for a festive breakfast, snack or dessert!

**Ingredients** 

Strawberry Layer:

1 cup plain nonfat yogurt (flavored, plain or vanilla yogurt will work fine) 1/3 cup strawberry puree

4-5 strawberries, thinly sliced

Honey and Banana Laver: 3/4 cup plain nonfat yogurt 1-2 teaspoon honey 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract 1 small banana, thinly sliced

Blueberry Layer: 1/2 cup plain nonfat yogurt 3 tablespoons blueberry or grape sauce or jam



# **Instructions:**

Bottom Layer-Combine yogurt and strawberry puree in a small bowl and mix well. Divide evenly among your jars or glasses and smooth the top. Place sliced strawberries on top of the yogurt layer.

Middle Layer—Combine the yogurt, honey and vanilla in a small bowl. Add on top of the sliced strawberries in your jars or glasses. Top with sliced bananas.

Top Layer—Combine the yogurt and blueberry syrup (or Jam) in a small bowl. Add on top of the sliced bananas in your jars or glasses. Top with fresh blueberries


