GROUNDHOG DAY FEBRUARY 2

Groundhog Day has its roots in the ancient Christian tradition of Candlemas, when clergy would bless and distribute candles needed for winter. The candles represented how long and cold the winter would be. Germans expanded on this concept by selecting the hedgehog as a means of predicting weather.

On February 2, 1887, German settlers in Pennsylvania continued the tradition and switched the animal to a groundhog.



RECIPE: Dark Chocolate Chip Oatmeal Bars



Gluten-free! These easy, homemade snack bars can help you feel fuller longer and keep you on a path toward healthier eating, and help satisfy your sweet tooth.

<u>Ingredients:</u> 1 large egg - 1/2 cup fat-free Greek yogurt (plain or vanilla) - 1/2 cup artificial sweetener brown sugar blend (like Truvia or Splenda) - 1 1/2 cups glutenfree quick oats - 2 tablespoons milled flaxseed - 1/4 cup bittersweet chocolate chips or bittersweet baking bar broken into small chunks

Directions:

- 1: Preheat oven to 350 degree F. Spray an 8x8 inch baking dish with cooking spray.
- 2: Whisk together the egg, yogurt and brown sugar blend.
- 3: Add oats, flaxseed and chocolate chips.
- 4: Spread mixture in an 8 inch square pan coated with cooking spray.

- 1. Social Security card and picture ID's for both you and your spouse and dependents.
- 2. All **2023** annual income statements or 2023 letter of record for you, your spouse and your dependents
 - a. W-2s wages
 - b. All 1099's Social Security, Pensions, Interest, Dividends, Financial Institutions/Investments, gambling, self-employment, etc. **REVIEW INTAKE FORM QUESTIONS CAREFULLY**
 - c. Medicaid, Veterans Benefits, Alimony, SSI Disability for dependents
- 3. Homeowners bring your **2023 Winter and Summer tax bills even if winter is not yet paid.** (for possible Property Tax Credit)
- 4. Renters bring your landlord contract including the name and address along with each month's rent payment amount for a possible MI Property Tax Credit
- 5. Total Heat Cost from 2023 **NOTICE IF HOUSEHOLD TOTAL INCOME EXCEEDS \$15,000 1 PERSON**; **\$20,000 -2 PEOPLE you do not qualify.**
 - a. SEMCO (natural gas) Heat credit is found on 12/23 or 1/24) statement
 - b. Indiana Michigan Power or Electric provider (dates November 22-October 23)
 - c. Propane/oil statement for all payments and company name
- 6. Health Insurance premiums you pay out of pocket
 - a. Advantage Plan
 - b. Medicare Supplement
 - c. Prescription Drug plan
- 7. Completed AARP Intake Form
